PETITIONER'S UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE REPLY BRIEF

Since then, counsel of record has been diligently working to prepare a reply and reply to the arguments presented both by Mr. Moulton and the MSPB. Because our reply must address two response briefs, additional time is needed to finish preparing the reply brief and to receive the necessary agency and supervisory review.

Further, additional time is needed because counsel of record is currently occupied with commitments in numerous other matters that will require the 44-day extension of time. Since Mr. Moulton and the MSPB filed their response briefs, undersigned counsel was occupied preparing a brief in support of the Department of Commerce's remand redetermination in Assan Aluminyum ve Ticaret A.S. v. United States, No. 18-1784 (Fed. Cl.), which was filed on October 10, 2024. Counsel also prepared a motion to dismiss in Miller v. United States, No. 24-1242 (Fed. Cl.), which was filed on October 11, 2024. Counsel also prepared a response to a motion to show cause in Webb v. Air Force, No. 24-2109 (Fed. Cir.), which was filed on October 15, 2024. Finally, counsel prepared a cross-motion for judgment on the administrative record in

Bassen v. United States, No. 23-211 (Fed. Cl.), which was filed on October 15, 2024.

In addition, before filing a reply brief in this case, counsel will file a motion to dismiss in *Moyer v. United States*, No. 24-1105 (Fed. Cl.), which is due October 17, 2024. Counsel will also file a motion to dismiss in *Prysmian Cables and Systems USA, LLC v. United States*, No. 24-101 (Ct. Int'l Trade), which is due October 25, 2024. Counsel will file a cross-motion for judgment on the administrative record in *Valles-Prieto v. United States*, No. 20-589 (Fed. Cl.), which is due October 28, 2024. Counsel will also be filing briefs over the next 45 days in *ITegrity, Inc. v. United States*, No. 24-1662 (Fed. Cl.), a time-sensitive bid protest in which a briefing schedule has not yet been set.

The extension of time requested will enable us to better assist the Court in resolving the appeal by providing a thorough and thoughtful brief addressing the arguments made by Mr. Moulton and the MSPB. Accordingly, we respectfully request that the Court grant this unopposed motion for an extension of time of 44 days, to and including December 6, 2024, for us to file our reply brief in this matter.
